Calpe

Calpe was once a small fishing village that Ernest Hemingway was fond of and is now one of the biggest and most popular tourist resorts on the Costa Blanca. It is a great place for water sports enthusiasts where everyone will find something for him/herself: swimming, sailing, scuba diving, windsurfing and kitesurfing. Also, fans of climbing and golf, which is very popular in Spain, will not be disappointed.

The symbol of the city is a powerful, lonely rock measuring over 332 m. N. P. m Called Peñon De Ifach. It is the smallest nature reserve in Spain! It is worth to choose the peak for which the medium-difficulty trail runs, through the bird sanctuary, with beautiful Mediterranean nature and the aromatic scent of herbs and trees. The place is home to approx. 300 animal species. From the pick you have a stunning panoramic view of the white coastline which looks amazing at the sunrise and sunset. There is a yacht port at the foot, Marina Calpe. The Rock also splits beaches: Cantal Roig and Playa La Fossa.

Calpe delights tourists with picturesque location, hot climate and fabulous sandy beaches....and the inhabitants are very proud of them as the cleanliness of the beaches has been confirmed with special prestigious "Blue Flag" certificate. The most popular beaches are: Arenal-Bol, La Fossa, La Calalga I Cantal Roig.

You can also take a walk to the Old Town which is the heart of this city. You can see there the historic buildings of e.g. famous architect Ricardo Bofill, the most interesting are: the red wall, Xandú and amphitheater. We can also explore the centuries churches Iglesia Antuiqua and Senora De las Neves, charming streets and green squares. There is a market every Wednesday that attracts tourists with antiques. If you want to buy local delicacies you must visit Mercado De Pescado, fish market which is famous not only because of fresh products but also from the fish auctions that take place daily between 17:00 and 20:00. If you want a ready-made dish, there is a choice of restaurants even for the most choosy gourmets.



Alicante



Alicante is a city with many faces. Here you will find traces of ancient Romans and Arab influences that penetrate the elements of Christian culture. It was from this place that Ferdinand Magellan sailed for a trip around the world. Now Alicante is one of the most significant ports in the Mediterranean Sea and the famous bustling resort open 24/7.

The city boasts of a beautiful seafront promenade called Esplanada de España lined with colored stones creating an interesting mosaic, planted with palm trees with numerous cafés, restaurants and bars, they clearly encourage long sitting and observing of people passing by.



The beaches are wide, clean and sandy, most popular are: San Juan de Alicante, Playa del Saladar, Playa de Postiguet.



There is a symbol of the city above it - Monte Benacantil, with ancient fortress Castillo De Santa Bárbara and it's worth to climb to. It was built on the site of the former Cartagena Fort, whose origin dates back to the third century BC, and it was witnessed many battles and was a point of significant military value still in the eighteenth century. In the mountains you can enjoy magnificent views of the city.



Interesting places to visit include the main Baroque town hall, Basílica De Santa María, Teatro Principal Museo De la Asegurada, Museo De Arte Sigmo 2000 covering works of Picasso, Tapies, Miro and Salvador Dali, Archaeological Museum or Vehículos Históricos Vall De Guadales -Automotive Museum. There are bullfights in Alicante in the Plaza de Toros, and also the museum where you can admire the exhibits associated with the biggest toreadors.



When you are in Alicante you can not forget about the trying specialities of the regional cuisine. Very popular in the region is Paella Marinera – type of Paella characteristic for this place. It is worth to taste sweet Turrón Duro which is one of the most popular versions of a Spanish dessert similar to halva, made from almonds, honey and egg whites.



Nearby:

A fantastic location close to Alicante is Elche with the largest olive palm tree grove. The largest and oldest palms can be seen in Huerto Del Cura which UNESCO listed as a World cultural and natural heritage. There are over 300 thousand palm trees!!!



Benidorm, until recently, was a small fishing village and now it is called the Spanish Las Vegas - it is an extremely popular resort with high skyscrapers and numerous hotels, which are growing almost on the sea - it is necessary to see after dark. Tourists also attract the theme park Terra Mítica and an aqua Park Aqualandia.



Les Fonts De L'Algar - you can spend all day swimming, diving, water jumping into the gorgeous lagoons created by the waterfalls.



Altea is a town separated from Calpe rocky cove. Its beautiful old town creates a picturesque mixture of white houses, narrow streets and stairs.



A fantastic attraction is also the sea cave Cova Dels Arcs, which hides in cliffs surrounding the beach of El Moraig. There is the underground river with green coloured water flows from it, flowing into turquoise sea which creates a very beautiful phenomenon. The expedition here is pure relaxation, great impressions and the opportunity to make gorgeous photos.



It is also worth seeing in the village Denia Beautifully located harbor.



The area surrounding the castle **Castell De Guadalest** It is one of the most beautiful fragments of the Costa Blanca. It is situated amidst the wild and extremely scenic mountains and massifs such as Sierra de Berna, De la Xortá, Serella, Aitana. For centuries this castle was not captured as Muslim Moors, who ruled in southern Spain from the 8th to the 16th century, built it on top of an inaccessible mountain and at his feet was formed village Guadalest.

To get into it, you have to go through the tunnel that is carved in rocks, called St. John Gate.



Wine

The region is famous for producing wines that are appreciated by the biggest connoisseurs from all over the world. Being in these areas, you have to visit one of the 44 vineyards and see for yourself how red, white or pink wine is produced. This unique flavored bouquet of wine from the region owes its influence of various Cultures: Greek, Roman or Arabic and each introduced to produce their improvements.



Valencia

Valencia is located at the **Turia** river, on the Mediterranean coast. It is the capital of the province and autonomous community of the same name. It is the third largest city in Spain.

Walk the Old Town in Valencia is extremely interesting, and it is a great way to get to know this amazing and beautiful city. Valencia buzzes with life and provides lots of attractions, is full of monuments and churches, modern solutions. It is a place with rich history and culture. Residents are famous for their passion for loud fest, football and good food.



This is where the biggest monuments of Valencia are located, such as Cathedral that hides the real treasure – the Holy Grail is stored here.
